Community Asset Transfers

As a community organisation you might have a great deal of knowledge about the community buildings in your area which are seen as valuable to the local community. You may be aware of a building owed by the local authority or by another similar public body that as an organisation you may aspire to own or manage. This might be possible under what is called a Community Asset Transfer (CAT).


Community Asset transfer (CAT) refers to the shift in management and/or ownership of buildings or land usually from public bodies (most commonly local authorities) to communities (usually to local community and voluntary sector groups). A community asset transfer can be either on freehold or, more commonly, leasehold term.

Community Right to Bid

The Community Right to Bid gives community groups a fairer chance to prepare and bid to buy community buildings and facilities that are important to them. This could include their:

- village shop
- pub
- community centre
- children's centre
- allotment
- library

The right covers private as well as public assets.

Local authorities are required to keep a list of all of these 'assets of community value'. If an owner of a listed asset wants to sell it they have to notify the local authority. The local authority then, in turn, has to notify any interested parties.

If local groups are interested in buying the asset they have 6 months to prepare a bid to buy it before the asset can be sold.

The Community Right to Bid came into effect on 21 September 2012. There is more information about the Community Right to Bid on the My Community Rights website, run by Locality.


