Aims/priorities:	<p>The current funding supports research which suggests that having close ties to friends and family, participating in meaningful social activities may help people maintain their thinking skills in later life, and slow down cognitive decline.</p> <p>There is particular interest in targeted interventions such as carers support and social groups, Maintenance Cognitive Simulation Therapy, or other interventions working to achieve outcomes such as the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improved ability of carers to meet the needs of people with dementia (ie, resources, knowledge, skills). • Reducing loneliness, isolation and creating social connection. • Improvements to physical health and cognitive function. • Better access to support services. • Increased independence and influence over their own lives and treatment.

Architectural Heritage Fund (AHF) - Project Development Grants for England

Aims/priorities:	<p>The wider Heritage Revival Fund is focused on regenerating historic buildings in town centres. Funding may be available for a small number of exceptional projects outside of these areas. These are likely to involve rescuing and re-using buildings of high heritage significance with clear potential to deliver strong social, economic and heritage regeneration benefits.</p> <p>Project Development grants are intended to help not-for-profit organisations with development work on historic building projects. Grants can contribute towards the costs of developing and co-ordinating projects and taking them towards the start of work on site. To qualify, an organisation must have established that the end use of the project is likely to be viable and have decided to take the project forward.</p> <p>Priority will be given to historic buildings in towns across England.</p>
Who can apply?	<p>Applications will be accepted from the following not-for-private profit organisations and lowest tiers of local government:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Charitable incorporated organisations (CIOs). • Charitable companies limited by guarantee. • Community benefit societies. • Not-for-private-profit companies limited by guarantee. • Community interest companies (CICs) limited by guarantee. • Co-operatives • Parish and town councils. • Independent secular organisations seeking to take ownership of a place of worship that will retain some religious use. Or an organisation associated with a worshipping community that is seeking to establish an independent secular organisation to take ownership of the place of worship, while the space will retain some religious use.
