	communities. The funding is for groups that need assistance to fulfil their potential in developing truly sustainable music programmes.
Who can apply?	Groups, schools and organisations that are bringing music to their communities in the UK can apply. Priority will be given to applicants who are most in need of help. Applicants are eligible only if they have been resident in the UK for a minimum of three years and are either a British Citizen or a national of a member state of the European Economic Area, or have been granted leave to enter or remain in the UK for an indefinite period or hold a certificate of right of abode in the UK.

Theatre Improvement Scheme 	
Aims/priorities:	<p>The scheme supports charitable theatre operators in the UK to carry out capital projects to improve their theatre buildings. Projects must fall within a specific theme each year.</p> <p>The current theme for the fund is Improving Environmental Sustainability as this is an urgent priority for the sector.</p>
Who can apply?	<p>To be eligible, applicants must meet the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Own or manage theatres with titles or signed leases of more than five years on buildings in England, Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland. • Demonstrate that they run a year-round programme of live performance, of no less than 30 performances a year. • Have a bona fide UK charitable or not-for-profit legal structure and be able to provide certified or audited accounts for at least two years. This can include local authorities or town and borough councils that own and/or operate a venue.

Family Fund Trust - Your Opportunity Grants Programme  Family Fund Helping disabled children	
Aims/priorities:	This dedicated grant programme aims to enhance the life of disabled, or seriously ill, young adults, aged 18 to 24 years old, living at home.
Who can apply?	To be eligible, applicants must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be the main parent, or carer, of a disabled or seriously ill young adult aged 18 to 24, who lives at home with them. • Not have received a Your Opportunity grant, on behalf of this young adult, in the past 12 months. • Have lived in the UK for the last six months.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a family on a low income from work, or benefits such as Universal Credit, Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit etc. <p>The young adult for whom the application is being made needs to have a high level of support needs, in three or more of the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Personal care, supervision and vigilance – needs support with feeding, washing, toileting, or needs to be supervised at all times. • Access to social activities – needs extra support to access social or leisure activities, including difficulty travelling, or where they are currently socially isolated. • Education/vocational training – has additional educational support needs, or needs extra help to attend vocational training. • Communication – needs support to listen, speak or understand. • Therapy and medical treatment – needs treatment or therapy. • Specialist resources used – needs resources such as a wheelchair, oxygen, screen magnifier or electronic communication aid. • The physical environment – needs support with getting around, travelling independently, and keeping safe.

Heritage Revival Fund		
Aims/priorities:	The funding is intended to help communities across England rescue and repurpose neglected historic buildings.	


	<p>The programme will focus on regenerating historic buildings in town centre locations by supporting community organisations to take ownership of, adapt and reuse the local heritage assets that matter to them, transforming them into thriving spaces that meet their needs.</p> <p>The Heritage Revival Fund aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maximise the regeneration benefits of community ownership and control of heritage assets, assisting in making communities fit for the future. • Protect, enhance and safeguard historic buildings across England, offering viable new uses for disused and underutilised properties. • Build capacity within local community groups, social enterprise, and charities. • Pilot innovative, alternative uses, ownership structures and investment models to facilitate long term regeneration. • Maximise the positive social and economic impacts around restoring historic buildings.
Who can apply?	<p>To be eligible, applicants must be one of the following not-for-private-profit organisations or lowest tiers of local government:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unincorporated charities (for Project Viability Grants only) • Charitable Incorporated Organisations (CIOs) • Charitable Companies Limited by Guarantee • Community Benefit Societies • Not-for-private-profit Companies Limited by Guarantee • Community Interest Companies (CICs) Limited by Guarantee • Co-operatives • Parish and Town Councils • Independent secular organisations seeking to take ownership of a place of worship that will retain some religious use. Or an organisation associated with a worshipping community that is seeking to establish an independent secular organisation to take ownership of the place of worship, while the space will retain some religious use. Ongoing worship must account for less than half of the proposed use of the space.
