<b>Golsoncott Foundation</b>		
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The Foundation's declared objective is "to promote, maintain, improve and advance the education of the public in the arts generally and, in particular, the fine arts and music".	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Voluntary sector organisations in the UK whose focus is primarily on the arts can apply for funding. 'The trustees favour applications from arts organisations whose raison d'être is the art form itself, and its perfection or excellence in performance.'	
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Funding is at the discretion of the Trustees. Grants tend to be between £250 and £3,000 with most in the £500 to £1,000 range.	
<b>Application process:</b>	Applications for the May 2026 meeting are now open. The nominal deadline is 2 May 2026. Once the maximum number of applications are received the application window will close.

<b>Music for All - Community Project Funding</b>		
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The grants programme aims to give a helping hand to projects and initiatives across the UK that are seeking to bring music to their communities. The funding is for groups that need assistance to fulfil their potential in developing truly sustainable music programmes.	

<b>Who can apply?</b>	Groups, schools and organisations that are bringing music to their communities in the UK can apply.
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Grants are at the discretion of the funders and values vary from round to round.

<b>Who can apply?</b>	<p>Constituted UK based organisations may apply.</p>

<b>Grant amount:</b>	<p>Grants of between £3,000 and £50,000 are available. Projects must have an overall cost of no more than £250,000. Projects must start within six months and complete within 12 months of funds being awarded.</p>

<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The funding is for programmes and projects that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Build financial confidence and capability – helping people manage their money and plan ahead.</li> </ul>

<b>Armed Forces Day Events Grant</b>		
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The objective of the fund is to support Armed Forces Day events across the UK to show support for our servicemen and women, past and present.	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Local councils, voluntary and community organisations, schools, ex-service organisations and individuals in the UK are eligible to apply.	

<b>Grant amount:</b>	The maximum grant available is £10,000. The amount of the grant will depend on the size and format of the event. The grant is match-funded. This means, a grant could cover up to half of the overall cost of the event. If the overall event cost is £7,000, the MoD could cover up to £3,500.
<b>Application process:</b>	The first step in the application process is to register the event on the Armed Forces Day website. Once groups have registered their event, they will receive a confirmation email within 15 working days. This email contains a link to submit an application for funding.
