<p>Aims/priorities:</p>	<p>The funding is intended for local organisations working with people who are disadvantaged, sick, have a disability, or living in poverty in the area.</p>
<p>Who can apply?</p>	<p>Registered charities, community interest companies, community groups and voluntary organisations can apply.</p>
<p>Grant amount:</p>	<p>Grants of up to £3,000 for any one year are available. Multi-year grants of up to £9,000 for up to three years (£3,000 per year) are available. The average annual grant is £1,000.</p>
<p>Application process:</p>	<p>Grant applications for up to £1,000 will be reviewed and assessed as quickly as possible. Applications for over £1,000 will go before the grants committee. An application form and further guidance notes can be found on The Charity Service website.</p>

<p>Trauma Responsive Greater Manchester Fund</p>	
<p>Aims/priorities:</p>	<p>Grants are available to help organisations across Greater Manchester embed trauma-responsive practice into their services, systems and spaces.</p>

	<p>The fund is designed to support organisations to move beyond basic awareness of trauma and take meaningful action to embed trauma-responsive approaches across their work.</p> <p>Trauma-responsive practice recognises the impact of trauma on individuals and communities, and focuses on creating environments that are safe, supportive, and empowering.</p> <p>All proposals must align with at least one of the priorities of the fund. Strong applications will demonstrate a clear understanding of trauma-informed principles, explain how these principles will be applied in practice, and set out robust outcome measures to show meaningful improvements in wellbeing and resilience.</p>

Aims/priorities:	<p>The grants programme aims to give a helping hand to projects and initiatives across the UK that are seeking to bring music to their communities. The funding is for groups that need assistance to fulfil their potential in developing truly sustainable music programmes.</p>	
Who can apply?	<p>Groups, schools and organisations that are bringing music to their communities in the UK can apply.</p>	
Grant amount:	<p>Grants are at the discretion of the funders and values vary from round to round.</p>	
Application process:	<p>An online application form is available to complete on the Music for All website. It is only available during the open application window.</p> <p>The process takes around three months from application to outcome notification.</p>

The programme focuses on strengthening a sense of belonging and connection to local identity by enabling young people to engage with stories from their communities and historic environment.
Who can apply?	Applications will be accepted from organisations of all types including community interest groups, charities and local authorities. Individuals can apply if they are registered as sole traders.
Grant amount:	The programme will fund around 25 projects of between £10,000 and £15,000 across England.

<p>Grant amount:</p>	<p>Grants of between £10,000 and £50,000 are available. The current average is about £21,000.</p> <p>Grants of between £40,000 and £50,000 are extremely limited and reserved for cases which demonstrate a very high case for investment.</p>
<p>Application process:</p>	<p>There is a two-stage application process.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stage 1 is a simple form to check the project is suitable for this programme.
