



Public sector funding to parks set to fall 60% over the next decade - so new models needed to sustain them

Heritage Lottery Fund and Big Lottery Fund have both funded parks in delivery of their missions

Joined up with Nesta, an innovation charity, to deliver a £1million grant fund

11 projects announced in July 2014 - innovating new ways of generating income and making parks sustainable

A brief history of 'BFT'

- Strong history of 'Networking' between VCS groups delivering services for Children, Young People and Families— shift towards formal collaboration began in 2010.
- Driver Public Service cuts, and an appetite from the Local Authority to do more business with the VCS sector.
- Investment from the Local Authority to support the development of BFT.

Better Futur

In 2012 BFT was born!

Today...

- Separate legal entity under the 'CVAT family'
- 40+ members
- Tiered membership so that small groups can be part of the supply chain.
- Development Officer to support
- Strong links to our development service and an emerging approach to peer support.



So, does it have any money?

- BFT has taken on the management of the 'Step up – Step out' grants scheme on behalf of the local authority.
- £150,000 over 2 years: grants to 6 groups and 'innovation' budget
- Link to the new direction of provision Public Service Reform Hub.



Opportunities and Challenges

- Shrinking resource to support v's increasing appetite to support within a new context?
- A lot of work for groups v's opportunities to bid for other grants available through CVAT and get support?
- Some groups have not taken up the opportunity and have 'lost out'.
- Evidencing the change this approach has made.





- We were formed by Salford's Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise
 Sector
- We are a separate legal entity Company Limited by Guarantee and Registered Charity
- Enables collaborative works to pursue funding and tenders
- We operate as a hub and spoke model additionally one member one vote
- We currently have over 75 member



Our Successes

- Unique within the Greater Manchester area
- Capacity building funding from 3 local funding pots
- Successful contract from Salford NHS to improve Older Peoples Mental health (£50,000)
- Community Learning Contract from Salford College (£360,000)
- Registered on the Salford City Council Personalisation Approved Providers List
- Registered on the Salford City Council Public Health Framework
