Launch of Salford Event Volunteers


The Volunteer Centre are excited to launch our new service Salford Events Volunteers. The Volunteer Centre is inundated with requests from organisations that are organising events and are desperate for volunteers to help out on the day. This project will work in three ways:

Community Work Activity Campaign

Community Work Placements is a mandatory element of the Back to Work scheme designed for those JSA claimants returning from the Work Programme whose key barrier to work is a lack of

work experience, motivation or both, and offers them a significant period of full-time activity. The scheme involves claimants undertaking a full-time work placement for 30 hours a week for up to 26 weeks alongside provider-led supported job search.

The key criteria of all placements are that they must be of benefit to the community and must not displace paid jobs.

Salford CVS does not view Community Work Placements as volunteering - because individuals are not freely choosing to participate in them, but rather will be faced with benefits sanctions if they do not engage in the compulsory placements.

This contravenes the widely accepted principles of volunteering:

- Volunteering is mutually beneficial
- Volunteering is independently chosen and freely given
- Volunteering is enabling and flexible wherever possible
- Volunteering is of community or social benefit
- Volunteering is offered to not for profit activities.



Salford CVS

Greater Manchester CVS' and Volunteer Centres have written and signed up to a position statement which outlines why the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise sectors should choose not to engage in this scheme as providers of "placements" in order to protect the principles of volunteering.
