Where has the funding come from?

Greater Manchester Police has a fantastic opportunity to invest cash to the value of £15,000 back into the Ordsall and Broughton communities of Salford. Bids can be placed for the funds up to the sum of £1,500 and is there for you to invest in your local groups and community activities.

What is the funding for?

This cash is to support your local groups and examples include funds to support planning community meetings, funds to purchase much needed equipment or even funds for assisting in transforming your street. Any bids submitted need to benefit the Broughton or Ordsall area and be sustainable.

Who can/cannot apply for funding?

Funding applications will not be accepted from private businesses however anyone else can apply for funding as long as it benefits the people/communities of Ordsall and Broughton defined by the ward maps. Only one application can be made for funds by a group/individual which will assist in bringing your community together. Applicants must have connections to the Broughton or Ordsall area (as defined by the map) by either living, working or receiving education in the area.

What can/can't we bid for?

Any bid's made must benefit the communities in Ordsall or Broughton. No bids can be made for anything involving illegal activity or anything political, exclusive or prejudicial.

How much can we bid for?

There is no minimum bid, the maximum any application can bid for is £1,500.

How will the bidding process work on the day?

Bidders will need to attend the event held at <u>Maxwell Hall</u>, <u>Peel Park Campus</u>, <u>Salford University</u> on the 29th January 2014 at 5.30pm for registration where all successful applicants will need to complete a two minute pitch.

Once all pitches are complete the members of the community who attend on the day will vote for the projects they want to fund. The applicants/bids that receive the highest votes will be successful in receiving their allocated funding.
