INRODUCTION

Since Big Local came to Little Hulton in 2012 research and consultation has consistently indicated that there is a need for a community hub in Little Hulton. However the research and consultation hasn't answered the following questions:

- Why do we need a community hub?
- What is there already in the area?
- What is already being delivered from these community buildings/hubs?
- What is the main target group?
- What are the gaps?

To provide answers to these questions this mapping exercise gives a brief description of each of the community buildings/hubs in Little Hulton and a timetable of activities taking place at each venue.

From this information the summary indicates what the gaps are.

- There is limited community provision for those with disabilities
- There is limited community provision addressing mental health and well-being
