*The Healthy Holidays Fund is open to voluntary, community or social enterprise sector organisations who want to put on summer activities for the benefit of school-aged children **to include provision of a healthy meal** for all or part of the **Summer Holidays 2019** (Sat 27th Jul - Sun 1st Sep).*

Is your organisation eligible to apply?

All organisations applying for Impact grants from Salford CVS must meet certain eligibility criteria as outlined below:

Membership of Salford CVS

Only voluntary, community or social enterprise sector organisations can join Salford CVS.

When you apply you'll need to upload a signed copy of your Constitution / Articles of Association.

Public liability insurance

We expect applicants to have public liability insurance in place before you apply. If you don't, you can include the cost of for 12-months cover in your Impact Fund application. See [this link](#) for guidance on public liability insurance.

Appropriate policies

All successful applicant organisations are expected to work with Salford CVS' Development Team over the coming year to develop effective policies and practices that will strengthen their organisation and open up wider funding opportunities. **As your project involves children you'll need to have a [child safeguarding policy](#) in place before you apply.**

Please note there is no turnover limit for organisations wishing to apply.

Guidance Notes

The Healthy Holidays Fund offers grants of up to £5,000 to VCSE sector organisations to help tackle holiday hunger and improve child nutrition over Salford's summer holiday period 2019. The fund has been inspired by Salford Food Share Partnership's Feeding Salford Plan.

Successful applicants will evidence cost-effective projects delivering good quality activities for children together with healthy meals. Targeting of those most in need will be done through smart marketing and promotion so as not to stigmatise those children and families in need.

Target Age Group

The Healthy Holidays Fund is designed to meet unmet need for children aged 11 - 16. However it is recognised that younger siblings are to be welcomed and accommodated.

Eligible costs include:

- Food and drink
- The cost of recreational activities for children (sports / arts etc.)
- Staffing costs and volunteer expenses
- Promotion and marketing
- Other reasonable costs associated with delivering the project




When completing the budget (question 26) a clear explanation of what you want the money for is required. Please include calculations to help us understand how you've reached each figure.

Example 1 **Acceptable:** Staff costs - 5hrs/wk @ £10ph x 5 weeks = £250
Not acceptable: Staffing £250

Example 2 **Acceptable:** Fruit juice @ £0.50 each x 50 people x 6 events = £150
Not acceptable: Drinks = £150

Neighbourhood footprint

The panel is looking to fund at least one project in each of Salford's 5 neighbourhoods. See map opposite. Only one application per organisation is permitted. Therefore applicants will need to select the neighbourhood which their project will serve (question 18).



What happens after the closing date?

All applications are checked for eligibility by Salford CVS. Applications are then assessed by a grants panel with representatives from three organisations. All applicants will then be informed of the outcome by email. Unsuccessful applicants will be given feedback on why their project did not receive funding and offered appropriate development support or training.

Applicants will be informed of the outcome by Friday 5th July 2019.

You could support other community / voluntary organisations and independent local businesses by shopping locally and keeping the money in Salford!

Spending with Salford in mind

Venue Hire Hiring community owned or managed venues helps maintain Salford's important community assets.

Refreshments Will refreshments be healthy? Will you include vegetarian, vegan, kosher and halal options? Will you be supporting local, independent shops or businesses?

Marketing and Publicity Have a think how you can support local printers or suppliers. Will you be using recycling paper, card or other materials?

T-shirts and other merchandise Whilst the vast majority of merchandise is manufactured in the far east, you can still do your bit for Salford and support local suppliers and shops. Organic cotton t-shirts are now more readily available.

Entertainment / activity costs Help keep your money within Salford and use local, independent businesses and suppliers where possible.

Awards and Certificates These could be hand-made by local people, and reflect the culture of Salford.
